History

The Trenton Civic Improvement Committee began as a division of the Trenton Bicentennial Civic Improvements Committee (1973-1977). In 1978, they became their own committee and supplied public and private plantings for gardens, planned programs about changing attitudes concerning littering, and planned activities to make Trenton clean for the Bicentennial and afterwards. They worked with neighborhood associations, block groups, school teachers, students, and city agencies to encourage residents to “think clean” and “keep clean”. The organization was dissolved in 1991.
